| <u>Glass</u>   | Due to global recycling changes, glass can no longer go in the blue bag recycling program  Glass jars can still be brought to the Eco Centres               | Broken glass, light bulbs,<br>glass jars,dishes,drinking glasses,<br>crystal, window glass, mirrors,<br>ceramics, Pyrex or tempered<br>glass   | Eco Centre Rinse bottles and jars, do not break glass, labels may be left on                    |
| <u>Metal Cans</u>  | EMPTY Aluminum, steel, bi-metal food and beverage cans & dry aluminum foil trays  | Aerosol cans, clothing hangers, scrap metal, screws, nails, toys, lawn furniture, paint cans, aluminum siding  | Rinse cans, crush if space is needed Please push lid down inside can Wipe out greasy containers |
| <u>Plastics</u><br>no lids or caps                             | EMPTY  -Plastic bottles stamped #1 to #7 -milk and water jugs -soda bottles -Hard ridgid plastic (detergent, condiment, shampoo margarine, ice cream pails) | -Soft flexible plastics (clamshell) -Styrofoam (packaging material, meat tray,take-out containers, egg cartons) -Plastic wrap (grocery bags,food wrap,re-sealable bags,bubble wrap) -Single use plastic items (straws, cutlery,coffee pods, to go cups) -Non packaging plastic (toys, lawn chairs, laundry baskets) -Oil or chemical bottles (pesticides/herbicides) | Rinse containers<br>Crush if space is needed  |
| <u>Cardboard</u><br><u>Newsprint &amp;</u><br><u>Magazines</u> | Cardboard Newspapers, magazines, catalogs, and phonebooks. Books are accepted if hard covers are removed.   | Metalic<br>Gift wrapping paper   | Please ensure that all boxes are broken down and flattened to maximize bin capacity             |

Absolutely **Do Not** place the following items in recycle containers:

- Batteries of any size or type
- Spray paint cans, aerosol cans, contaminated medical waste or needles
- Lawn hoses, tree branches
